LP	Writing Criteria
9	<p>Students can:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Communicate their ideas in writing with impact, having an intended effect on the reader.• Show a confident understanding of the text type they are supposed to be writing.• Produce written texts effective to purpose, that show ambition in their structure.• Structure written texts through use of ambitious and effective paragraphing.• Use a wide range of ambitious sentence structures, types and openings for intended effect on the reader• Develop a precise use of vocabulary that is ambitious• Demonstrate accurate use of the full range of punctuation for effect on the reader• Make sure spelling is virtually error-free.
8	<p>Students can:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Communicate ideas in writing to convince their reader.• Produce written texts that use imagination and are effectively structured• Structure written texts through use of effective paragraphing.• Use a range of sentence structures, types and openings that is becoming more ambitious• Demonstrate mostly accurate use of the full range of punctuation for effect on the reader• Make sure spelling is mostly error-free.
7	<p>Students can:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Consistently produce texts that communicate their ideas clearly and engage a reader.• Clearly use the features of the text type they are writing, including an effective structure• Organise, order and develop their paragraphs in detail.• Use different sentence types, structures and start sentences in different ways accurately and for effect on the reader.• Select from a range of vocabulary for effect.• Use the full range of punctuation accurately for effect on the reader.• Spell nearly all words accurately.
6	<p>Students can:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Produce texts that make their ideas clear and sustain the reader's interest• Use the features of the text type they are writing to produce a clear and well-structured text• Develop their ideas with organization using paragraphs.• Vary sentence types and structures appropriate to the purpose of their writing. Sometimes they will use sentences for effect.• Use vocabulary for purpose and effect.• Use the full range of punctuation, with occasional errors.• Demonstrate mostly accurate spelling, with occasional errors.

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5	<p>Students can:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Begin to sustain the reader’s interest and communicate important ideas clearly. • Use the features of the text type that they are writing effectively to show that they understand the purpose. • Organise writing into a suitable structure and use paragraphs effectively. • Sometimes write using a variety of sentence types, structures and sentence starters for purpose and effect. • Sometimes use a range of vocabulary for purpose and effect. • Accurately use spelling, a range of punctuation and grammar most of the time.
4	<p>Students can:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Communicate some ideas clearly in writing. • Use some of the features of the text type they are writing with some understanding of purpose. • Use paragraphs correctly to group ideas together • Attempt to vary their use of sentence types and sentence structures. • Choose some vocabulary for effect. • Use punctuation and grammar with some accuracy • Use spelling with some accuracy.
3	<p>Students can:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Make simple ideas clear in writing. • Produce a text with a simple structure that shows some understanding of purpose. • Sometimes use paragraphs to group ideas together. • Control they use of sentences and use some different sentence types and structures in writing. • Use vocabulary that is familiar to them for effect. • Spell correctly, use punctuation and grammar correctly some of the time.
2	<p>Students can:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Make some of their ideas clear in writing. • Try to produce a text that shows the features of the text type. • Try to organise the text into a structure and attempt to use paragraphs. • Show some control in their use of sentence types. Sometimes they can use different sentence structures. • They use vocabulary that is familiar to them in writing. • Try to use spelling, basic punctuation and grammar correctly.
1	<p>Students can:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Put ideas down in writing. • Produce a complete text. • Try to group related ideas together in the same place. • Use simple sentences and simple vocabulary • Attempt to spell and use punctuation in writing
