#### **Careers Highlights**

Following the highly successful Key Stage 4 Transition Evening, we are excited for our Year 10 and Year 11 students who have now started the next stage of their Careers Education journey at Soar Valley College.



Our Year 10 cohort have been busy completing their work experience online application forms for their placements which will run in June 2026. Self-placement applications are being accepted until Monday 27<sup>th</sup> October.

Our Year 11 cohort have now started their college application process. Students are busy writing their personal statements and researching courses and providers for their Post 16 education or training.

As always, our annual Post 16 Options Evening was a huge success. A range of Post 16 providers from across the city and county came to Soar Valley College to speak with students and parents / carers to provide information about pathways available after Year 11. The ambitious and mature attitude of our students, as it always does, impressed the providers and we received really positive feedback from them all.

Universities, colleges, apprenticeship providers and training hubs were on hand for the evening to share information about courses and training possibilities. ### **DESIGN & TECHNOLOGY**

#### **DT Club - Countdown Calendar Project**

This term, students attending the Design and Technology After-School Club have taken part in an exciting hands-on project: designing and creating their very own **countdown calendars** using industry-standard tools and techniques.

Over the course of several weeks, students were introduced to **CAD software** on which to design their calendar templates. They explored different festive and seasonal themes, with some creating Christmas countdowns, birthday trackers, or event-based calendars.

Once their designs were complete, students used the **laser cutter** to precisely cut their calendar components from thick card. They then used the **vacuum former** to mould plastic trays, creating compartments to hold small treats or tokens behind each countdown window.

The project gave students the opportunity to:

- Develop their digital design skills
- Learn about manufacturing processes
- Work with specialist equipment
- Solve design challenges creatively and independently

The final results were impressive and highly individual, showcasing the students' creativity, technical skill, and attention to detail. Each student took home a fully functional, reusable countdown calendar!

We're incredibly proud of the enthusiasm and dedication shown by everyone involved. The club continues to provide a valuable space for students to explore practical design and technology in a fun, supportive environment.

#### **Year 6 STEM Challenge Inspires Creativity**

During the summer holiday students in Year 6 were set a STEM Transition Challenge designed to encourage creativity, problem solving and independent learning. Each student was invited to design and construct a model at home, with the aim of showcasing their skills in, and enthusiasm for, science, technology, engineering and mathematics [more commonly called the STEM subjects].



On their return to school, now as Year 7 students, participants brought in their completed entries. These were shared in a celebration assembly, where prizes were awarded in recognition of the students' efforts and achievements.

Following the assembly the models were displayed at breaktime for all year groups to view. The showcase generated a great deal of interest across the school community, with many students taking inspiration from the innovative designs and thoughtful ideas on display.

The students who took part in the challenge rose to the high standards expected at Soar Valley College. Their creativity, perseverance and enthusiasm will no doubt encourage future participation in similar projects.

Mr Pabari, Principal, who presented the prizes during the assembly, commented: "It was inspiring to see the level of imagination and effort that went into these projects. The students have not only demonstrated impressive STEM skills but have also shown the commitment and ambition that we value so highly at this school."

Mrs Yadav, Director of Science, who designed and launched the challenge, added: "The quality of the entries exceeded expectations. It was wonderful to see so many students engage with the task and take real pride in their work. They have set a fantastic benchmark for future cohorts."

## **Extended Transition Programme**

#### **Year 7 Extended Transition Programme**

Throughout this half term, Year 7 students have been participating in an extended transition programme designed to support their successful integration into life at Soar Valley. As part of their induction, students have explored our core values and engaged in sessions focused on the *Soar Valley Way* – emphasising **Effort, Participation**, and **Respect**.

During these sessions, students collaborated to develop a clear understanding

of what outstanding effort looks like, and how they can actively contribute to our school community, including through the wide range of extracurricular opportunities available to them.

We have also reinforced our approach to promoting a safe and respectful environment by revisiting our definition of bullying: **STOP** – *Several Times On Purpose*, and emphasised the importance of reporting concerns using the principle **STOP** – *Start Telling Other People*.

Additionally, students reflected on the impact of small, everyday actions that demonstrate respect, such as wearing full school uniform and arriving to lessons punctually.

#### **Year 8 and Year 9 Extended Transition**

Year 8 and Year 9 students have focused on evaluating their effort and participation, thoughtfully reflecting on their experiences over the past year and setting ambitious, well-considered targets for this year. Their commitment and positive attitude have been outstanding, and in recognition of their excellent contributions, they were rewarded with some well-deserved sweet treats.

#### **Year 8 Outdoor Pursuit Centre Trip**

As part of our ongoing work to support students to develop the skills required for success, in September Year 8 students had an incredible opportunity to visit the Leicester Outdoor Pursuit Centre, where the focus was on teamwork, resilience, and pushing personal boundaries.

From the moment they arrived the students were encouraged to step out of their comfort zones and take on a range of exciting and challenging activities. Whether it was climbing, abseiling, canoeing, or navigating obstacle courses, every experience required courage and determination.

For some, the biggest challenge was trying something completely new, while for others it was about overcoming fear and building self-confidence. What made the day so special was the way students supported each other throughout the activities. Encouraging words, cheers, and teamwork helped everyone feel included and motivated, even when the tasks seemed daunting.

The sense of camaraderie grew stronger as the day went on, and students discovered how important it was to rely on and trust one another. Facing these challenges together not only helped develop problem-solving and leadership skills but also strengthened friendships and built resilience.

By the end of the trip, the students involved were left with a sense of pride, a feeling of achievement, and a greater belief in their own abilities thus proving that stepping outside their comfort zones can be both rewarding and empowering.
